A group of volunteers known as Woody do woodland management activities in various woodlands around the borough. They work at The Coppice, Woodnook Vale & Whinney Hill green space areas. Activities vary each month/season so please contact Mike to find out more about their planned activities. At the moment as it is the bird nesting season they will not be felling but will be processing the felled timber and also installing benches and waymarkers. Help them to sort hazel coppice into products including bundles of hazel rods, rustic poles for garden structures, bags of kindling sticks and cords of firewood logs. Anyone interested must book as volunteers need to wear appropriate PPE and we need to make sure enough tools are available to keep everyone active. Any new helpers are welcome for any amount of time.</p> <p>You will acquire lots of woodland management skills volunteering with Woody and work with a friendly and helpful team of regular volunteers. Wednesday, 6th September 10:00am	NATURE & PHOTOGRAPHY WALK - We will be exploring part of Laund Clough Wood at Baxenden, Peel Park & The Coppice and open countryside. Laund Clough Wood is owned by The Woodland Trust. Laund Clough is a popular local wood for nearby residents, mainly used by dog walkers and children playing. Mature trees such as beech and ash share ground with regenerating elm, beech, and sycamore. Peel Park occupies an elevated position overlooking the town of Accrington at the top of Avenue Parade. The Coppice is excellent for brisk, variable terrain walks. A number of small forestry planting projects in recent years have added greater interest to the site and in turn a greater diversity in animal species to the area. Start 10:00am from the main gates at Oak Hill Park, Manchester Road, Accrington. Grid Ref: SD766277. Finish approx. 1:00pm. Leisurely pace across formal paths, fields, footpaths and tracks. WINDFALL FUNDING AVAILABLE THROUGH PROSPECTS



WINDFALL FUND. Since 2012 we have funded 79 projects and awarded a total of £348,968. There is an 84% success rate for grant applications so if you have a project that fits one of our six themes and needs a mini grant of up to £250, a small project of £250 - £2000 or a large project needing more than £2,000 get in touch now. **See Mondays in the What's On section.**

The Windfall Fund has been established from proceeds from the new Hyndburn wind farm on Oswaldtwistle Moor. The Fund is a community benefit fund that is being provided by EnergieKontor, the wind farm developer, and we have secured an agreement with EnergieKontor to manage the Fund on their behalf for the lifetime of the wind farm. Grants are available to community groups throughout Hyndburn for environmental projects which will improve the quality of life of local residents and contribute to the sustainable development of the Borough.

This means money is available for environmental projects in Hyndburn for at least the next 20 years!

Making homes for wildlife - Environment

We want to create a range of natural habitats for a wide variety of local wildlife including butterflies, hedgehogs, birds and frogs.

£1,557.71 raised so far with the Co-op Local Community Fund



We want to create and enhance habitats for wildlife. Bees, butterflies, hedgehogs, birds and frogs will all be enticed to take up residence in new natural surroundings. We already work with local groups and schools developing and managing green spaces, woodlands, food growing areas and community gardens but many of these lack the additional wildlife habitats vital for our native species to thrive. We will run training and activity sessions on habitat creation including creating wildflower meadows and bog gardens; planting hedgerows, fruit bushes and heritage orchards; building bug hotels, bird boxes, feeders and habitat piles. The outcomes will be more homes for nature in the area and local people gaining skills in creating wildlife habitats and in identifying the species that use them.

Members can choose to give 1% of what they spend on Co-op branded products and services to the PROSPECTS cause.

Environmental Awareness Activities & Workshops i.e. CRAFTS & Arts & Crafts will run from 1st April until September 2017 - recycled crafts, traditional rural crafts, workshops using recycled materials, wildlife gardening etc. Walking is starting in April & Cycling will start soon and run until September 2017.
