PROSPECTS PARKING – There is disabled parking on Broadway outside PROSPECTS accessed from Whalley Road. There is public parking accessed off Eastgate near Dowry Street from the A680 and at the Arndale Centre which can be accessed from Castle Street and the roundabout at the end of Hyndburn Road. There is short stay parking on Whalley Road in designated parking bays.

Oak Hill Park is situated between Manchester Road and Hollins Lane in Accrington and can be entered at four points, two from Manchester Road and two from Hollins Lane. The park’s main entrance is on Manchester Road. There is the opportunity for parking for disabled patrons at the higher Manchester Road entrance; no other parking is available within the grounds of the park.

Oak Hill Park – Directions & Parking
 From the M65 eastbound turn off at Junction 7, then take the 3rd exit at the roundabout (from the westbound direction take the first exit off the roundabout onto the A6185 (Dunkenhalgh Way) towards Accrington. At the next set of traffic lights/crossroads continue straight ahead into Hyndburn Road. At the roundabout take the third exit into Castle Street and at the traffic lights take the right hand filter lane to carry straight on along into A680 (Eastgate/Whalley Road then name changes to Abbey Street). Continue along the A680 through four sets of traffic lights (about 1 mile) Continue for approximately 460 metres and Oak Hill Park is on the right.

Courses are FREE to Hyndburn residents. Funded projects and organisations may be ask to contribute towards student registration fees.
